



Dear parishioners,

Build Bridges, not Walls

Recent murders in Manchester, and the murder of Coptic Christians in Egypt, have once again taught us the need for change in our world. In 1964, Pope Paul VI wrote a letter to Catholics throughout the world, and also addressed it to all people of good will. He wrote to people of different religious beliefs, and mentioned at one point the Jews, the Muslims, and followers of the great Afro-Asiatic religions. Pope Paul noted that we cannot assume that all religions are equal, and we should not be indifferent or uncritical about religious belief.

Yet our Pope asked us to do something very important. He wrote: *"But we do not wish to turn a blind eye to the spiritual and moral values of the various non-Christian religions, for we desire to join with them in promoting and defending common ideals in the spheres of religious liberty, human brotherhood, education, culture, social welfare, and civic order. Dialogue is possible in all these great projects, which are our concern as much as theirs, and we will not fail to offer opportunities for discussion in the event of such an offer being favourably received in genuine, mutual respect."* [Ecclesiam Suam, para 108]

Since Pope Paul wrote, more than fifty years have passed. Conflict, within religions and between religions, has become a greater problem than ever. One response is to shut out the problem from our lives, from our homes, from our schools. In effect, one response is to build walls. But Pope Paul called us to a better response. Of course it may not be easy to find the people of good-will. It may not be easy to develop genuine, mutual respect. And it may not be easy to find the opportunities to join together to promote and defend common ideals. Building bridges is never easy – but we need bridges more than walls.

There may be religious division in our own families, and we can begin building bridges even there. Building bridges reaches across barriers and divisions, and enables us to live together. Building bridges gives us hope for the future.

Although there are many examples of hatred and violence, we need not despair. Seek the help of the Holy Spirit in this time of Pentecost, to give us courage and to find our future.

This was the first letter of Pope Paul. He concluded by writing: *"And so we end this our first encyclical on a note of great joy in the union of our spirits which has its origin in Christ"* and he gave his blessing to all humankind. We, too, can find that joy and repeat that blessing.

ENROLMENT



If your child is due to start in Term 3, 2017 please complete and return their enrolment application as soon as possible. We are processing enrolments now.

ILLNESS



Winter is fast approaching and so are the bugs unfortunately. If your child is unwell please think about their well-being and the well-being of others and decide whether they should rest at home. The exclusion period for children that have vomited or started antibiotics is 24 hours before coming back to school. Further guidelines have been included below.

Exclusion from childcare, preschool, school and work

The spread of certain infectious diseases can be reduced by excluding a person, known to be infectious, from contact with others who are at risk of catching the infection.

The following are recommended minimum periods of exclusion from school, preschool and childcare centres for cases of, and contact with, infectious diseases, based on guidelines issued by the [National Health and Medical Research Council](#) in December 2005 and the 10th edition of the [Australian Immunisation Handbook, 2013](#).

These guidelines can also be applied to the general community and most workplaces. A childcare worker with gastroenteritis (also known as 'gastro': inflammation of the intestinal (bowels)), should not return to work for at least 24 hours after vomiting or diarrhoea have stopped.



Exclusion periods

The need for exclusion depends on:

- the ease with which the infection can be spread
- the ability of the infected person to follow hygiene precautions
- whether or not the person has some immunity to the infection (either from vaccination or past infection)
- to a lesser extent, the severity of the disease.

Definitions

Exclusion periods are based on the time that a person with a specific disease or condition might be infectious to others.



Non-exclusion means there is not a significant risk of transmitting infection to others. A person who is not excluded may still need to remain at home because he or she does not feel well.

A **contact** is any person who has been close enough to an infected person to be at risk of having acquired the infection from that person.

***** SAFETY *****

PEDESTRIAN CROSSING: Can you please ensure that you cross the road using the pedestrian crossing. We have seen some students and parents running across the road in-between traffic. This is extremely dangerous when there are cars driving in all directions and visibility is poor. Please set the right example and use the pedestrian crossing which is supervised by staff.

CAR PARK: Our car parks are set up with one way in and one way out. Please enter the carpark via the entrance near the roundabout. DO NOT do a right hand turn from Shepherdson Road into the carpark (as shown on the map). This blocks the traffic and creates congestion, frustration and danger. It is easier and quicker to drive down to the roundabout, go around and then enter the car park using the slip lane.

DROP OFF ZONE: When entering the car park to use the drop off zone please make sure you use both sides of the car park (as shown by the yellow lines). This will keep the traffic off the road and alleviate congestion on Shepherdson and Martins Roads. If you are in the front side of the car park please allow cars from the far side to merge into your lane for the Drop Off Zone. Let's work together as a Community and help keep everyone safe.



LOST PROPERTY

Please ensure all items are labelled this will enable us to return lost property to its rightful owner. When we receive lost property we check for a name, look up their class and return via our class box. Class boxes are dropped off in the morning and collected in the afternoon.

You are welcome to have a look any time at any remaining lost property which is located in Student Reception.

MEDICATION

It is school policy for all medication to be kept in the sick room (located near student reception). A medication plan signed by your doctor should also be provided for any medication required by a student throughout the day whether long term or short term. This includes but not limited to panadol, nurofen and antibiotics. This policy is enforced to ensure your child takes the correct dosage at the correct time which is logged by our staff and to prevent other students from taking medication which could be harmful. A care plan is also required for any child that may be incontinent. Your assistance and understanding on this matter is greatly appreciated.
