

Major Learnings when I was away

- Empathy
- Efficacy
- Kindness
- Impact

Someone asked me when I had previously taken significant leave from my position as Principal and I replied that it was when my third child arrived. He is now 27 years old! He is now a doctor specialising in Radiology and doing his PhD. He takes after his mother!

Previously, I had taken leave mainly in the school holidays to undertake a range of fantastic learning experiences over the past 42 years during my various tenures as Principal or Consultant. I am grateful for the opportunities I have been afforded: amazing trust, support and patience has been forthcoming to me from CESA and you, the community I serve.

In the first 6 weeks of this renewal leave I was gathering resources for a Scoping Review of the topic "Inclusion in Australian Schools (2014-2024): the strategies which facilitate inclusion and the factors which mitigate against inclusion in Australian schools in this period". I have been working with Professor Chris Boyle from Adelaide University as part of my Masters Degree.

My Project is to examine the strategies used in contemporary schools which will engender inclusion while also identifying other factors in schools which mitigate against inclusion. I am using the Scoping Review process.



The other thing I was doing was having a complete break from school and enabling Nick, Ruth, Jake, Anthony and Emma to have their go at running the school. This may be surprising to some, I found this to be very easy to achieve because I didn't feel I had anything to prove. When I was at school I was me and now it was their turn.... I had complete trust in the Leadership Team and Brady from CESA.

In the next phase, I attended the Alberta Teachers Association Leaders Conference in Banff Canada with 1100 other leaders from around the world!

This was an outstanding learning event with a withering range of provocations centred around leadership in the current context.

I renewed my acquaintance with my erstwhile mentor Michael Fullan Professor of Education from Toronto.



Anyway, its great to be back on deck, I hope to see you soon.


How to register your child/children?

My School Dentist through the Australian Dental Foundation will visit our school in **week 4** of term 2 (20-25 May) for dental check-ups during school time for children in Early Learning to Year 6.

If your child requires further follow-up treatment, the My School Dentist team will contact you to discuss the available options and obtain consent prior to performing any additional treatment. If no further treatment is required, your child will be seen in the next 6 to 12 months for their routine dental check-up.

After the dental check-up, children will be sent home with an oral health report card and free oral health pack, as well as you will be contacted by the treating dentist via phone regarding their appointment.

A registration pack is available for collection from the front office or please email info@holyfamily.catholic.edu.au for one to be sent home with your child. Please return the completed registration form to the front office by **Tuesday 14 May**. Staff from the My School Dentist program will collect the forms and contact you to confirm a booking.

Please note a new registration form is required for the 2024 calendar year even if your child has seen the dentist in previous visits.




FROM THE APRIM

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

A warm welcome back as we begin Term 2. I trust that you and your children have enjoyed lots of quality time together and had an opportunity to refresh.

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower." John 15:1



Sunday's Gospel was taken from the Last Supper discourse. In this passage, Jesus uses the metaphor of the vine and the branches to teach his disciples that his relationship with them will not end with his death, that he will be with them always. It is through this unity that the disciples are able to continue Jesus' work and bear good fruit. It is through the Scriptures that we come to know Jesus and it is through the Gift of the Holy Spirit that we are able to continue the work of



CELEBRATING DIVERSITY... SALISBURY CATHOLIC PARISH

"Strength lies in differences, not in similarities." - Stephen R. Covey.

Dearly beloved parishioners and friends,

We are lucky to live in one of the most vibrant and multicultural countries on earth-from the oldest continuous culture of our First Australians to the cultures of our newest arrivals worldwide. This Sunday is a great day to celebrate the bonds of faith that unite us and give us much hope and encouragement. Within that, Salisbury is a very vibrant and diverse parish where I experienced the generosity and excitement of so many coming together, united by the common bond of faith. Salisbury parish has more than 34 nationalities and many more cultural groups. Today is an excellent opportunity for all of us to experience prayerful communion across languages and cultures.

The church has been diverse since its birth at Pentecost when the disciples "were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim" (Acts 2:4, 7-11). As Paul wrote to the divisive Christians at Corinth, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. Corinthians 12:12). The Acts of the Apostles emphasises the cultural diversity of the Antioch church because it was here that the disciples were first called *Christians* (11:26). The newly coined term, meaning "Those of Christ," was invented to describe these believers in their unprecedented mix. Pagan Antiochians knew about Jews worshipping in their synagogues. They also had heard of Gentiles who had become proselytes to Judaism, and they likely were familiar with the "God-fearers," Gentiles who revered Israel's God but who stopped short of complete conversion. Christ tears down the walls of hostility that divide Jews from Gentiles, making former enemies into friends and equals in the faith (Ephesians 2:14-16). This fundamental redemptive equality is well expressed in Galatians 3:28, where the apostle writes, " There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." Now, Christianity's two-thousand-year-old diversity is reshaping the Catholic Church in Australia. As we approach Multicultural Day, let us remember its profound significance. This day, rooted in the belief that 'everyone belongs', is a testimony to our cultural diversity. It's a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Salisbury Parish their home. Multicultural celebration is not just an event but a call to action. It encourages us to participate in our community, respect diversity, and foster a sense of belonging for everyone.

Conversation is so imperative in seeking to understand and appreciate each other. If we genuinely want to get to know each other, we must spend time together. We need to be generous in offering hospitality to each other. We need to pray together and share some food. During this day's Mass and celebrations, we pray for our country and parish, asking God's grace to guide us. We pray that we may embrace and welcome the diversity that is our strength, remembering that

- * Send an email to absent@holyfamily.catholic.edu.au





Early Collection Guidelines

- Advise the front office of your need to collect your child early. This can be done
 by phone, in person or email to absent@holyfamily.catholic.edu.au
- <u>Upon arrival please sign out the student</u> via the iPad on the front desk and staff will call for your child to come to the front office if not already in Student Services.
- <u>Cancel any OSHC bookings</u> via the Xplor app and bus bookings will be forfeited.
- <u>Defer any lunch orders</u> (if before 10:00am)
 or have the lunch order collected to take home
 if canteen have it ready.

School finishes at 3pm



The front entrance gate will be open by 2:30pm for families to enter the school to wait for their children on site. If needing to take your child early please sign them out before going to the classroom.

Carpark Gate 1 is opened as close to 2:30pm as possible. The gate leading to the Kiss and Drop Zone will be opened either at 2:45pm or when the school bus has arrived (whichever comes first).

The side and rear gates will be opened when the teacher on duty arrives just after 3pm.

Please make an OSHC booking if you cannot collect your child/children on time.

Pedestrian Safety

Please use the footpath between the carpark and road when walking your children to the school gates

Use the pedestrian crossings to ensure everyone stays safe.

Pick Up & Drop Off Safety

Use the Kiss & Drop driveway if you cannot get out of your car
